



GOD’S WORDS FOR TODAY (Mt. 21:33-43, 45-46)

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew,

Listen to another parable: There was a landowner who planted a vineyard. He put a wall around it, dug a winepress in it and built a watchtower. Then he rented the vineyard to some farmers and went away on a journey. When the harvest time approached, he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his fruit. "The tenants seized his servants; they beat one, killed another, and stoned a third. Then he sent other servants to them, more than the first time, and the tenants treated them the same way. Last of all, he sent his son to them. 'They will respect my son,' he said. "But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, 'This is the heir. Come, let's kill him and take his inheritance.' So they took him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. "Therefore, when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" "He will bring those wretches to a wretched end," they replied, "and he will rent the vineyard to other tenants, who will give him his share of the crop at harvest time." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the Scriptures: "The stone the builders rejected has become the capstone; the Lord has done this, and it is marvelous in our eyes?" "Therefore I tell you that the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.

Reflections:

The lesson of the parable is clear.” Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance”. Jesus is the son rejected and killed. But he rises again and becomes the cornerstone of the new community, now composed of “Others” to whom the vineyard is entrusted. The church is the spiritual heir of Israel and carries the same responsibility. God expects from the believers the fruits of his vine. Do you feel privileged and grateful for the call to belong to the Christian community? In your service of leadership imbued with the spirit of Christ? If Christian leaders themselves fail to recognize the identity and mission of Jesus they will threaten the very life of the community. They are charged with a great responsibility to lead people to God and not themselves.

Cont... Heart-healthy diet

Heart attack risk factors include:

- Family history of heart attack. If your siblings, parents or grandparents have had early heart attacks (by age 55 for male relatives and by age 65 for female relatives), you may be at increased risk.
- Lack of physical activity. An inactive lifestyle contributes to high blood cholesterol levels and obesity. People who get regular aerobic exercise have better cardiovascular fitness, which decreases their overall risk of heart attack. Exercise is also beneficial in lowering high blood pressure.
- Obesity. Obesity is associated with high blood cholesterol levels, high triglyceride levels, high blood pressure and diabetes. Losing just 10 percent of your body weight can lower this risk, however.
- Stress. You may respond to stress in ways that can increase your risk of a heart attack.
- Illegal drug use. Using stimulant drugs, such as cocaine or amphetamines, can trigger a spasm of your coronary arteries that can cause a heart attack.
- A history of preeclampsia. This condition causes high blood pressure during pregnancy and increases the lifetime risk of heart disease.
- A history of an autoimmune condition, such as rheumatoid arthritis or lupus. Conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, lupus and other autoimmune conditions can increase your risk of having a heart attack.
