**POLICIES AND RULES ON DISCIPLINE (Continuation...)**

**On Attendance and Punctuality**

1. All students who have incurred absences are held responsible for all works/tasks or requirements missed during the period of absence.
2. A letter addressed to the GM shall be required before a student is allowed to attend classes. This letter should be prepared and signed by the parents or guardian and the body of the letter should contain the following information: The student's name and section, date of absence and reason for absence. Failure to present a letter to the GM shall be dealt as stipulated in the schedule of offenses and sanctions. A phone call is not a substitute for a letter.
3. A letter does not automatically excuse an absence. The decision to excuse or not to excuse the student's absence rests with the GM. (Student's absence can be excused if the cause of absence is sickness, death in the immediate members of the family or other obligations required by law).
4. Only letters prepared by the Parents or Guardians shall be honored.
5. A student who accumulates more than forty (40) absences during the school year shall be dropped from the list of students.
