GOD'S WORDS FOR TODAY (Lk. 24:13-35)

The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

That very day, the first day of the week, two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village seven miles from Jerusalem called Emmaus, and they were conversing about all the things that had occurred. And it happened that while they were conversing and debating, Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing as you walk along?" They stopped, looking downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, said to him in reply, "Are you the only visitor to Jerusalem who does not know of the things that have taken place there in these days?" And he replied to them, "What sort of things?" They said to him, "The things that happened to Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, how our chief priests and rulers both handed him over to a sentence of death and crucified him. But we were hoping that he would be the one to redeem Israel; and besides all this, it is now the third day since this took place. Some women from our group, however, have astounded us: they were at the tomb early in the morning and did not find his Body; they came back and reported that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who announced that he was alive. Then some of those with us went to the tomb and found things just as the women had described, but him they did not see." And he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures. As they approached the village to which they were going, he gave the impression that he was going on farther. But they urged him, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened and they recognized him, but he vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" So they set out at once and returned to Jerusalem where they found gathered together the Eleven and those with them who were saying, "The Lord has truly been raised and has appeared to Simon!" Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

How often do we fail to recognize the Lord when he speaks to our hearts and opens his mind to us? The Risen Lord is ever ready to speak his word to us and to give us understanding of his ways. Do you listen attentively to the Word of God and allow his word to change and transform you?

Lord Jesus Christ, open the eyes of my heart to recognize your presence with me and to understand the truth of your saving word. Amen.

To refresh and strengthen our preparedness if an earthquake happens, we will be having an earthquake drill anytime today. Please be guided by the following:

Staying Safe Inside and Outside Your Classroom

During an Earthquake

- 1. Do the DUCK, COVER and HOLD. Find something that can cover you like tables and chairs.
- 2. Move as little as possible. Most injuries (sprains, fractures and head injuries) during earthquakes occur because of people moving around. Try to protect your head and torso.
- 3. If outside, find a clear spot and drop to the ground. Stay there until the shaking stops. Try to get as far away as possible from buildings, power lines, and trees.
- 4. Stay calm and DO NOT PANIC. Be ready to evacuate and to go to the assembly area (OVAL) if you are sure it is safe to exit/move.

After an Earthquake

- 1. Once the shaking stops you need to be ready to evacuate. Use the stairs and do not attempt to use the elevator.
- 2. Use the route designated for your class if you are inside your classroom. Class Presidents are requested to make a review of their route with their classmates.
- 3. If you are not inside your classroom (at the canteen, library, roof deck, court, or in any place inside the school), you should not panic. Be vigilant in checking your surroundings going to the assembly area. If your route gets crowded, do not push one another to avoid stampede and commotion.
- 4. Check to make sure that there is no debris from the building that could fall on you. In case there is, find a safer alternate route to go to the assembly area.
- 5. Expect and prepare for potential aftershocks.
- 6. Each time you feel an aftershock, do the DUCK, COVER and HOLD. (Aftershocks frequently occur minutes, days, weeks and even months following an earthquake.)

Notes:

- 1. Class Secretaries will help the Class Presidents in checking the attendance of the class once you reached the assembly area.
- 2. Flaglets are still part of the evacuation. Bring it if the earthquake/drill happens while you are inside the classroom. It will help us to easily monitor attendance.
- 3. For classes who are not in their classroom during the drill/earthquake, Class Presidents and Secretaries are required to check the attendance and should report it to their Adviser and GM.
- 4. Lasallian Partners are also requested to proceed immediately to the assembly area. If in case the drill/earthquake happens during recess or lunch break, the next subject teacher shall be in charge of confirming the attendance of the class.
- 5. Nowadays, it is advisable to always have a buddy. Do not go somewhere inside the school ALONE. Get a COMPANION.

6. We should all remember that "everyone's safety is our topmost concern," so, we need to execute the evacuation CALMLY and SERIOUSLY.

80TH BIRTHDAY OF FORMER PRESIDENT JOSEPH EJERCITO ESTRADA

Joseph Estrada was born on April 19, 1937, in Manila, Philippines. He is a <u>Filipino</u> politician who served as the <u>13th</u> <u>President of the Philippines</u> from 1998 to 2001 and as the <u>9th Vice President of the Philippines</u> from 1992 to 1998. He has been <u>Mayor</u> of the <u>City of Manila</u>, the country's capital, since 2013. Over the course of his prolific film career, he has acted the lead role in more than 80 films and produced over 70. In 1992, he ran for vice president and won. In 1998 he became president of the Philippines. In 2001 he was arrested and imprisoned for six years. He ran for re-election in 2010, but lost to Benigno Aquino III.

Cont...Brain Aneurysm

What are the symptoms?

Most brain aneurysms cause no symptoms and may only be discovered during tests for another, usually unrelated, condition. In other cases, an unruptured aneurysm will cause problems by pressing on areas in the brain. When this happens, the person may suffer from severe <u>headaches</u>, blurred <u>vision</u>, changes in speech, and <u>neck pain</u>, depending on what areas of the brain are affected and how bad the aneurysm is.

Symptoms of a ruptured brain aneurysm often come on suddenly. If you have any of the following symptoms or notice them in someone you know, call or other emergency services right away:

- A sudden, severe <u>headache</u> that is different from past <u>headaches</u>.
- Neck pain.
- Nausea and vomiting.
- Sensitivity to light.
- Fainting or loss of consciousness.
- <u>Seizures</u>.
