Bone & Joints Awareness Week

Maintain Muscle Balance

We've already mentioned that muscle is important as a way to protect joints and bone. At the same time though it important to make sure that the muscle is well balanced and proportioned. Muscle places force and tension on your joints by pulling or pushing them, and if this is not equal on either side it can cause your joints damage and result in discomfort. So balance your body out – don't train the pecks without training the traps equally, and likewise don't train the quadriceps if you're not going to train the hamstrings.

Address Problems Early

If you have any problems that you notice with your joints or bones, then it is important to see a specialist as soon as possible whether they be a doctor or a physiotherapist. This is crucial as ignoring the problem can exacerbate it, or the rest of your body can try and compensate for the problem resulting in further imbalances. Even if you don't think the discomfort is anything serious, something like a stress fracture can occur with no obvious cause or provocation so it's always worth getting checked out.
